Please give us a brief report for this trauma fellowship program:

Every morning I went the round of patients with Dr. Tang and other young surgeons. These young surgeons introduced new or post-op cases to Dr. Tang.

Sometimes there were grand rounds with Prof. Leung and medical students.

When I joined operations, I was an assistant.

The most surprising thing was that many things were different from ours for example, a gown, a washstand instrument (internal fixator). First time I wondered, although Hong Kong is a modern great city, why they put on worn-out gowns and use old type instruments? (We live in very country side but use disposables and for example we commonly use locking plates for fractures of the distal radius.

Of course I know that health economics between Japan and Hong Kong are different and we Japanese doctors are in a too good environment.

On considering about early healing and post-op complications, expensive one is good and useful. But now I think we should put the right one in the right place from an economic point of view.

When I saw post-op wound there were many skin problems (infection, ruptured suture...)

I'm interested in wound healing very much and confident to some extent.

On Tuesday and Friday I studied by observation at trauma clinic. Dr. Tang taught me various interesting cases.

Above all, acetabular fractures were fresh to me. I have never seen it!

This time I came here as an almost inexperienced doctor. So, if ever I have a next chance I want to study abroad after having experienced a great deal. Because I'm sure to see in a different point of view from this time.
